


# Your tour hosts



### Day 1: Wednesday, 22 March 2017 - Arrive Hong Kong

No activities are planned for today and you are welcome to fly in at any time. A shared arrival airport transfer takes you to your starting hotel in bustling Tsim Sha Tsui.

### Day 2: Thursday, 23 March 2017 - Hong Kong BD

This morning is free leisure time. In the afternoon meet in the hotel lobby for a heritage walking tour of Hong Kong's historic sights. Tonight you are invited to join your hosts for a welcome dinner. Over dinner Hong Kong historian Dr Catherine Ladds will share her research on foreign communities in China.

### Day 3: Friday, 24 March 2017 - Hong Kong | Jiangmen BL

After breakfast travel by ferry to Jiangmen (3 hours), our first stop in mainland China. After lunch visit the Wuyi Overseas Chinese Museum, before an optional visit to the Wuyi University Overseas Chinese Culture Research Centre. In the evening visit downtown Pengjiang to explore and enjoy dinner at your leisure.

### Day 4: Saturday, 25 March 2017 - Jiangmen | Kaiping BLD

In the morning travel to Candong in Kaiping to explore its village heritage with architectural historian Dr Selia Tan from Wuyi University. Learn about local conservation efforts and the village's Australian connections. After a traditional lunch, visit the magnificent Li Yuan mansion and garden.

### Day 5: Sunday, 26 March 2017 - Kaiping BL

Today explore the Kaiping *diaolou* and villages with Dr Selia Tan, who worked on the successful UNESCO World Heritage bid. Places to visit include the Tanjiang river, Chikan town, and Zili and Majianglong villages. In the afternoon join us for an optional traditional countryside afternoon tea.

### Day 6: Monday, 27 March 2017 - Kaiping | Taishan

This morning travel to Duanfen in Taishan, the ancestral home of Quong Tart and the Mei (Moy) clan, visiting unique sites such as the Mei Family Compound. After lunch join an optional walking tour of the old town of Taicheng or spend the afternoon at leisure.

### Day 7: Tuesday, 28 March 2017 - Taishan | Xinhui | Zhongshan BLD

After breakfast visit Shiquli in Xinhui, a village whose connections to Australia stretch back 150 years. Then explore nearby Chen Chong to help solve a history mystery! After lunch at tranquil Yutai Temple, visit the scenic Guifeng Mountain Park and the Palm Tree Museum.

### Day 8: Wednesday, 29 March 2017 - Zhongshan BD

Enjoy a special Cantonese yum cha breakfast before visiting heritage sites in Shiqi (Shekki), the old part of Zhongshan city. Highlights are the Xiangshan Commercial Culture Museum and historic Sun Wen West Road. After an afternoon at leisure, visit Sanxi village for a dinner with a historic twist.

### Day 9: Thursday, 30 March 2017 - Zhongshan | Zhuhai BLD

This morning visit the Museum of the Former Residence of Sun Yat-sen and the Zhongshan Folklore Culture Museum in Cuiheng. After lunch enjoy a stroll by the sea before continuing to Waisha in Zhuhai, the ancestral home of one-time Sydney residents Choy Hing and Choy Chong of the famous Sun Company department store. Celebrate our final night together with a farewell dinner in Zhuhai.

### Day 10: Friday, 31 March 2017 - Zhuhai | Hong Kong B

After breakfast transfer to Jiuzhou Wharf for our return ferry to Hong Kong (1 hour), where the tour concludes. A shared departure airport transfer takes you to the airport to meet your flight home.

### Booking your place
